### XIV. Discussion/Action Items

a. **Environmental Health Coalition re: Barrio Logan CPU Ballot Initiative:** The Barrio Logan CPU was approved by City Council after an extensive multi-year consensus process and an initiative to overturn the approved the CPU was filed immediately. Corrine Wilson – volunteer with yes on B&C campaign. On the June 3<sup>rd</sup> ballot. Signature gatherers spread many false rumors regarding the CPU. The CPU was created by a large group of stakeholders. Consensus was reached on most issues despite large diversity of stakeholders.

#### **MOTION: Whereas,**

The North Park Planning Committee does not support planning processes by initiative; The NPPC believes the community plan update process for Barrio Logan was transparent and inclusive; Should the proposition fail the NPPC is concerned about the profound implications for future community plan updates city-wide.

Therefore the NPPC supports San Diego City Council decision to approve the community stakeholder derived community plan update and endorses the passage of Propositions B & C on the June 3, 2014 City of San Diego ballot. Carlson/Gebreselassie 15-0-0

- c. Update & Clarification on the two proposals regarding University Heights Boundary Issues:
  - i. There has been confusion for decades over the precise delineation of the University Heights Neighborhood Boundaries in the North Park Community. The NPPC believes it is imperative to resolve this issue and recommends using a sanctioned government organization to establish the boundaries. The NPPC recommends using the San Diego County Assessor's Office parcel maps, (which are consistent with the University Heights subdivision designation on individual property deeds), to define areas that are within the University Heights Neighborhood Subdivision within the North Park Planning area boundary.
  - ii. The NPPC finds that, while private dues-paying organizations have the undisputed right to determine and serve whatever area best meets their mission, nevertheless they should not be permitted to either dictate the naming of a neighborhood outside of their service area, nor to *exclude* an area outside their own service area from any neighborhood name. Neighborhood names should be:
    - 1. Established through a neutral official governmental body.
    - Be determined by residents, business and property owners who reside or operate in the area in question, including the choice to identify the area in which they reside by either neighborhood or community name, as both are correct.

- iii. To clarify further; there is a difference between a Neighborhoods' Boundaries and a Community Planning Area's Boundaries. Communities are made up of many neighborhoods. For example, you can live in the Altadena Neighborhood in the Community of North Park. This gives residents and business the choice to use either designation or both.
- iv. Thomas Andrino sees El Cajon Blvd as the border and wants to be able to call his area something appropriate.

### MOTION:

The NPPC considers that no individual or private group should dictate or deny the choice of resident, business or property owners to name or identify their own neighborhood as specified by an official government document. Thus allowing residents, property and business owners the choice to decide what to call the local area in which they reside, work and play.

The NPPC requests the updated North Park Community Plan include language establishing the University Heights neighborhood boundaries within the North Park Community, and that these boundaries be based on the independent, neutral and official SD County Assessor's Parcel Maps of the University Heights Subdivision.
